

Inter-Faith Community Services Organizational Fact Sheet

WHAT	Inter-Faith Community Services (IFCS), established in 1964, is a nonprofit, nonsectarian social services organization that provides essential services and case management to enable families, children, individuals and senior citizens to move from dependence to independence and from dysfunction to successful living.
MISSION	To use community resources to provide basic human services and enrichment programs to low-income people, while fostering self-sufficiency and respecting the dignity of each client.
SERVICES	<p>Homeless Prevention: Provides assistance with utilities, rent, or mortgage. IFCS also has two Transitional Housing Programs, designed to move families from homelessness to permanent, affordable housing.</p> <p>Financial Assistance: Provides assistance with bus tokens, gas vouchers, medical prescriptions and birth certificates.</p> <p>Hunger Prevention: Operates the largest food bank in the South Metro Denver area. Additionally, through our enrichment Holiday Programs, eligible families and seniors are provided with the makings of Thanksgiving and Christmas meals.</p> <p>Youth Services: Provides children from low-income families in grades K-8 with necessary school supplies, including a backpack, new clothing, and gift certificates (shoes and haircut) for the beginning of the school year. Also, the Food for Learning Program provides schools funding for their daily lunch service to children on the federal reduced-lunch program.</p> <p>Senior Services: Provides services to low-income homebound seniors such as Lunch Bunch, Grocery Shopping and Medical Transportation.</p> <p>Other Services:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">Clothing Bank - Provides no-cost clothing to clients.Gift of Sight and Hearing Programs – Provides for those in need of low-or no-cost hearing aids or glasses.Crime Victims Assistance Program – Provides support and resources for crime victims.Recreation Passes – Allows clients to access community recreational programs.Career Center – Provides employment tools so that clients can achieve their employment and career goals.Case Management and Follow-Up- For clients in IFCS programs.Referral Program - Helps clients access other community resources.

SERVED	IFCS serves more than 16,000 individuals annually who reside in Centennial, Englewood, Glendale, Highlands Ranch, Littleton, Lone Tree, Sheridan and unincorporated Arapahoe County.
STAFF	Inter-Faith Community Services employs 12 staff members (11 full-time and 1 part-time). It also utilizes more than 8,000 volunteers who donate more than 26,000 hours annually.
FUNDING	IFCS's annual budget of \$1 million dollars is funded primarily through foundation, local, state and federal grants, individual, corporate, church, and civic organization contributions. Inter-Faith Community Services also receives, throughout the year, in-kind donations totaling more than \$1.4 million.
