



**Report of Services  
September 1, 2013 through August 31, 2014**

**15,448 low-income individuals were served during fiscal year 2013-2014**

**NEW CLIENTS**

▶ 623 new families, individuals, and senior citizens came to IFCS for assistance

**HOMELESS PREVENTION**

▶ 550 individuals received homelessness prevention assistance, totaling \$142,818

**HUNGER PREVENTION**

▶ 5,552 individuals received hunger prevention assistance, totaling \$777,280. Meals distributed-116,592

**FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE**

▶ 780 individuals received assistance with medical prescriptions, transportation, birth certificates, hearing aids, and Sargent Fund, totaling \$10,483

▶ 289 crime victims received assistance, totaling \$68,426

**ENRICHMENT PROGRAMS**

▶ Ready, Set, School!

- 531 children received new clothes, backpacks, and school supplies-Ready, Set, School!
- 405 children received backpacks and school supplies-Project Backpack

▶ Holiday Programs

- 4,077 individuals benefited from receiving food and gifts for Thanksgiving and Christmas
- 285 children received toys for Christmas

**SENIOR PROGRAMS**

▶ 47 seniors participated in Lunch Bunch, Grocery Shopping and Medical Transportation programs

▶ 103 seniors received food and gifts for Thanksgiving and Christmas

**OTHER ASSISTANCE**

▶ 1,686 individuals received clothing, totaling \$58,440

▶ 1,108 individuals benefited from receiving recreation passes from South Suburban and Englewood Recreation, distributed through IFCS

▶ 16 individuals accessed the IFCS' Career Center

▶ 19 individuals received eyeglasses through IFCS' Gift of Sight program

**REFERRALS**

▶ 5,959 referrals were made to other organizations

**VOLUNTEERS**

▶ 2,037 volunteers gave 9,796 volunteer hours
