

Integrated Family Community Services Organizational Fact Sheet

WHAT	Integrated Family Community Services, formerly Inter-Faith Community Services (IFCS), established in 1964, is a nonprofit organization that provides essential services and case management to enable families, children, individuals and senior citizens to move from dependence to independence and from dysfunction to successful living.
MISSION	To use community resources to provide basic human services and enrichment programs to low-income people, while fostering self-sufficiency and respecting the dignity of each client.
PROGRAMS	<p>Homeless Prevention Program: Provides assistance with utilities, rent, or mortgage. IFCS has two Transitional Housing Programs, designed to move families from homelessness to permanent, affordable housing.</p> <p>Hunger Prevention Program: Operates the largest food bank in South Metro Denver.</p> <p>Financial Assistance: Provides assistance with bus tickets, gas gift cards, medical prescriptions, and birth certificates.</p> <p>Gift of Hearing – Provides for those in need of low-or no-cost hearing aids.</p> <p>Crime Victims Assistance – Provides support and resources for crime victims.</p> <p>Enrichment Program: Provides children from low-income families in grades K-High School with necessary school supplies, including a backpack, new clothing, and gift certificate for shoes for the beginning of the school year. Additionally, through our enrichment Holiday Programs and Mother’s Day Gift Baskets, we distribute food to eligible families and seniors.</p> <p>Other Programs:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Clothing Bank - Provides no-cost clothing to clients.• Recreation Passes – Allows clients to access community recreational programs.• Gift of Sight – Provides for those in need eye glasses• Case Management and Follow-Up- For clients in IFCS programs.• Referral Program - Helps clients access other community resources.
SERVED	More than 20,000 individuals annually who reside in Centennial, Englewood, Glendale, Highlands Ranch, Littleton, Lone Tree, Sheridan and unincorporated Arapahoe County through programs, services, and referrals.
STAFF	Employs 13 staff members (9 full-time and 4 part-time). It also utilizes more than 2,000 volunteers who donate more than 7,000 hours annually.
FUNDING	Annual budget of \$1 million dollars is funded primarily through foundation, local, state and federal grants, individual, corporate, church, and civic organization contributions. IFCS also receives, throughout the year, in-kind donations totaling more than \$1.4 million such as food donations.
EFFICIENCY	92 cents of each donation dollar goes to programs and services. Each dollar that is given to IFCS can be multiplied into three dollars through local partnerships and in-kind relationships. Each type of support is maximized for efficiency.
