

Report of Services September 1, 2014 through August 31, 2015

14,604 low-income individuals were served during fiscal year 2014-2015

NEW CLIENTS

▶ 578 new families, individuals, and senior citizens came to IFCS for assistance

HOMELESS PREVENTION

▶ 531 individuals received homelessness prevention assistance, totaling \$142,818

HUNGER PREVENTION

► 5,552 individuals received hunger prevention assistance, totaling \$601,860. Meals distributed-90,279

FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE

- ▶757 individuals received assistance with medical prescriptions, transportation, birth certificates, hearing aids, and Sargent Fund, totaling \$3,400
- ► 232 crime victims received assistance, totaling \$57,031

ENRICHMENT PROGRAMS

- ► Ready, Set, School!
 - 506 children received new clothes, backpacks, and school supplies-Ready, Set, School!
 - 359 children received backpacks and school supplies-Project Backpack
- ► Holiday Programs
 - 3,099 individuals benefited from receiving food and gifts for Thanksgiving and Christmas
 - 301 children received toys for Christmas
- ► Mother's Day
 - 593 individuals benefited from receiving Mother's Day Baskets

SENIOR PROGRAMS

- ▶ 15 seniors participated in Lunch Bunch, Grocery Shopping and Medical Transportation programs
- ▶ 114 seniors received food and gifts for Thanksgiving and Christmas

OTHER ASSISTANCE

- ▶ 1,401 individuals received clothing, totaling \$56,440
- ▶ 1,139 individuals benefited from receiving recreation passes from South Suburban and Englewood Recreation, distributed through IFCS
- ▶ 5 individuals received eyeglasses through IFCS' Gift of Sight program

REFERRALS

▶4,009 referrals were made to other organizations

VOLUNTEERS

► 2,035 volunteers gave 7,624 volunteer hours
