



**Report of Services
September 1, 2015 through August 31, 2016**

12,431 low-income individuals were served during fiscal year 2015-2016

NEW CLIENTS

▶ 472 new families, individuals, and senior citizens came to IFCS for assistance

HOMELESS PREVENTION

▶ 509 individuals received homelessness prevention assistance, totaling \$164,392

HUNGER PREVENTION

▶ 5,898 individuals received hunger prevention assistance, totaling \$825,720. Meals distributed-123,858

FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE

▶ 340 individuals received assistance with medical prescriptions, transportation, birth certificates, hearing aids, and Sargent Fund, totaling \$1,794

▶ 197 crime victims received assistance, totaling \$60,000

ENRICHMENT PROGRAMS

▶ Ready, Set, School!

- 519 children received new clothes, backpacks, and school supplies-Ready, Set, School!
- 332 children received backpacks and school supplies-Project Backpack

▶ Holiday Programs

- 3,295 individuals benefited from receiving food and gifts for Thanksgiving and Christmas
- 140 children received toys for Christmas

▶ Mother's Day

- 621 individuals benefited from receiving Mother's Day Baskets

OTHER ASSISTANCE

▶ 1,171 individuals received clothing, totaling \$46,760

▶ 1,001 individuals benefited from receiving recreation passes from South Suburban and Englewood Recreation, distributed through IFCS

▶ 24 individuals received eyeglasses through IFCS' Gift of Sight program

REFERRALS

▶ 4,007 referrals were made to other organizations

VOLUNTEERS

▶ 3,593 volunteers gave 5,619 volunteer hours
