



**Report of Services  
September 1, 2016 through August 31, 2017**

**15,225 low-income individuals were served during fiscal year 2016-2017**

**NEW CLIENTS**

▶ 407 new families, individuals, and senior citizens came to IFCS for assistance

**HOMELESS PREVENTION**

▶ 419 individuals received homelessness prevention assistance, totaling \$125,377

**HUNGER PREVENTION**

▶ 6,338 individuals received hunger prevention assistance, totaling \$887,320. Meals distributed-133,098

**FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE**

▶ 210 individuals received assistance with medical prescriptions, bus tickets, gas cards, birth certificates, and Sargent Fund, totaling \$1,000

▶ 197 crime victims received assistance, totaling \$52,410

**ENRICHMENT PROGRAMS**

▶ Ready, Set, School!

- 390 children received new clothes, backpacks, and school supplies-Ready, Set, School!
- 374 children received backpacks and school supplies-Project Backpack

▶ Holiday Programs

- 2,625 individuals benefited from receiving food and gifts for Thanksgiving and Christmas
- 66 children received toys for Christmas

- 380 individuals benefited from receiving Mother's Day Baskets

▶ 1,100 individuals received clothing, totaling \$42,920

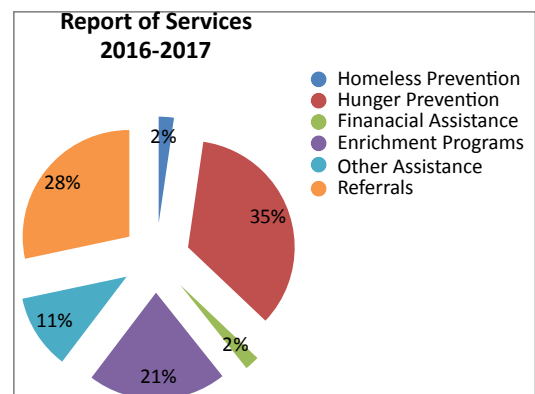
▶ 967 individuals benefited from receiving recreation passes South Suburban and Englewood Recreation, distributed through
