▶ 429 new families, individuals, and senior citizens came to IFCS for assistance

**HOMELESS PREVENTION**

▶ 428 individuals received homelessness prevention assistance, totaling \$105,240

**HUNGER PREVENTION**

▶ 6,088 individuals received hunger prevention assistance, totaling \$584,130

**ENRICHMENT PROGRAMS**

▶ Mother's Day

- 430 individuals (118 families) benefited from receiving Mother's Day Baskets, total \$7,670

▶ Ready, Set, School!

- 319 children received new clothes, backpacks, and school supplies-Ready, Set, School!, totaling \$95,700
- 395 children received backpacks and school supplies-Project Backpack, totaling \$29,625

▶ Holiday Programs

- 1,897 individuals benefited from receiving food and gifts for Thanksgiving and Christmas, totaling \$131,000

**REFERRALS**

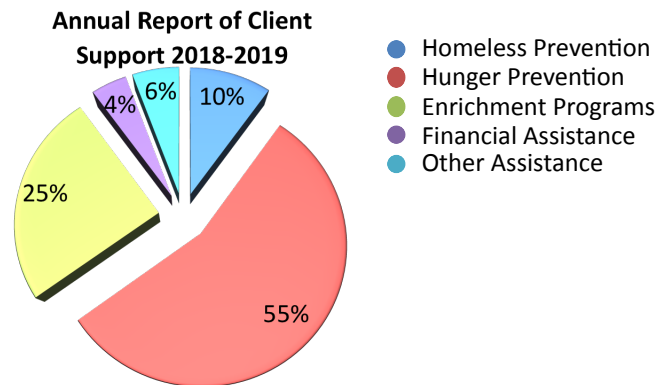
▶ 4,342 referrals were made to other organizations
